RE: Motivation behind political donations

I refer to your letter dated 6 November 2017 and respond to your questions on behalf of Crown Resorts Limited (**Crown**) as follows:

1. Could you outline the reasons why you make political donations?

Crown makes donations to registered political parties to support the democratic and electoral process in Australia. Given the cost of election campaigns, registered political parties in Australia rely heavily on donations in order to communicate their messages and policies to the Australian public. Crown discloses all donations and fully supports a transparent disclosure system.
