

On late last month the minister for Immigration and citizenship Senator Chris Evans introduced a new bill namely MIGRATION AMENDMENT (VISA CAPPING) BILL 2010. I strongly disagree with this bill and I think everyone who calls himself to be a proud Australian will oppose this bill.

Australia- A country which runs on the policy of fair go. Where everyone is treated equally. But this bill will bring such a bad name and the worst reputation for Australia on an international level from the immigration point of view.
