# Upgrade to Melbourne immigration facility under scrutiny

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works is conducting an inquiry into proposed upgrades at the Melbourne Immigration Transit Accommodation (MITA) facility in Broadmeadows, Victoria. The upgrades will provide 140 beds across two high security compounds as well as the necessary amenities and security infrastructure.

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection states that a recent trend towards a higher risk detention population means that the low-risk MITA facility must be upgraded to ensure the accommodation is suitable to house a range of detainees, including higher risk individuals. Upgrading the existing facility will reduce costs and increase efficiency while maintaining the safety of occupants through improved security measures. It will also provide a level of amenity that is consistent with other Australian immigration detention centres that accommodate higher risk detainees.

Works are expected to begin in March 2017 and be completed by October 2017. The estimated cost of the project is \$29.06 million (excluding GST).

It is anticipated that the Committee will conduct public and in-camera hearings for the inquiry early in 2017. Further information on the public hearing will be available soon.
