#### Question:

In relation to the comment made by the Victorian Health Minister on ABC Radio National Breakfast on 24 June that "National Cabinet agreed to a suppression strategy not an eliminations strategy":

- a. When was this decision taken?
- b. Was the decision made based on AHPPC advice?
- c. What materials were relied on in making this decision?

#### Answer:

a. The National Cabinet has endorsed a strategy of suppression.

It is a longstanding practice not to disclose information about the operation and business of the Cabinet and its committees, including when the matter went to Cabinet, who attended, and what form of submission was provided, as to do so could potentially reveal the deliberations of the Cabinet, which are confidential.
