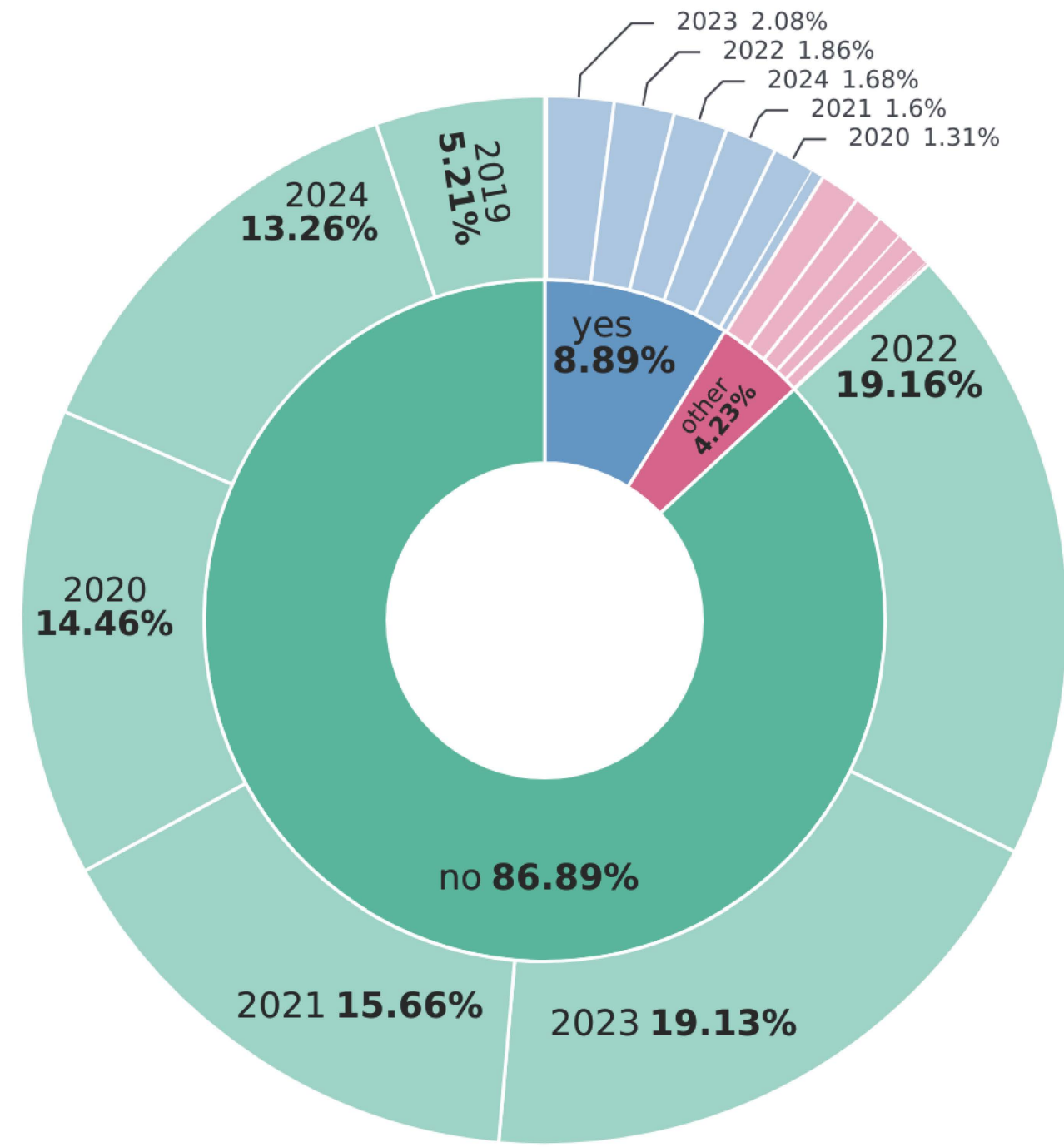


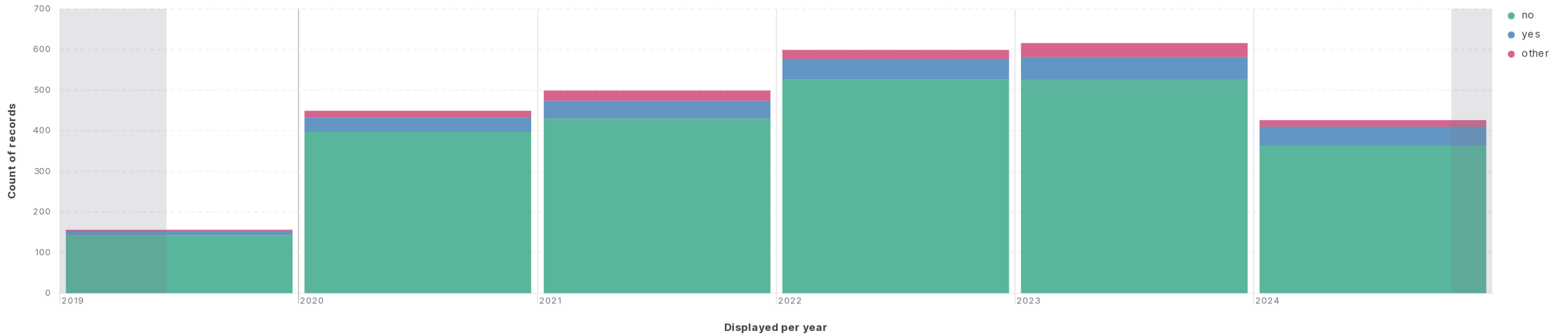

NT Victims Identified as AOTSI Year on Year



On 1 July 2019, the Commonwealth (C'wlth) commenced nationwide reporting of cyber crimes on the cyber.gov.au website. A snapshot of the data provided by the C'wlth since inception is attached.

Data is from victims who are individuals. Data does not include businesses as a victim and does not include anonymous reports.

These statistics rely on victims reporting via the cyber crime portal on the cyber.gov.au Cwlth website. It is a known fact that persons in remote communities can have limited access to reliable internet access.

In relation to the donut graph:

- In summary since 1 July 2019, the total percentage of those persons who identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and who have reported as a victim on the website is 8.89%. The centre ring in the graph represents this entire reporting entire period (2019-2024).
- The graph is presented in percentages, ascending.
- The outer ring represents the individual percentages for each year for the entire period.

In relation to the bar graph:

- This is the same data as provided in the donut graph, however, is presented in year by year format.
- The years 2019 and 2024 are part years only.
- In summary, the number of persons who identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and who have reported as a victim on the website is:

– 2019	6.41%
– 2020	8.02%
– 2021	8.82%
– 2022	8.52%
– 2023	9.25%
– 2024	10.8%
