

Hi, I am 16 years old and I was conceived by anonymous donor conception. Although I do not want a father figure in my life anymore, I am still interested to know more about my medical history and background on my other side.

One thing I would be interested in is finding out about any half-siblings I have. If both families agreed it would be nice to meet and get to know half-siblings. If they did not want to meet, a list of half-siblings' dates/years of birth, sex and maybe non-identifying information about them.

I also believe that the amount of siblings born to each donor would not have to be limited if there was a more complete knowledge of half-siblings, including the donor's children.

I think that the donors should also be given a chance to reconsider the choice they made years ago, about whether they want to remain anonymous, or whether they want to disclose more information, or meet their offspring. Even if they choose not to act, it still reminds them of the fact that there are children out there that they helped conceive, that are curious about their origins.

I think donor-conceived individuals should have the right to know more of their heritage, instead of relying on basic information of eye, hair and skin colour, height, and the occupation and hobby the donor enjoyed at the time of donation. I would not be interested in having legal or financial rights over a donor, but to have a chance to contact him, and ask questions.
