The problem(s)

Problem One: Lack of funded MRIs

The electorate of Longman is grossly under serviced in the provision of MRI services available to the local population whose income is below the national average. The neighbouring electorate Petrie is also undersupplied. The people of Longman are required to either join the queue to access the solitary MRI licence in the region, travel into the Brisbane City or simply go without.

The queue

The only existing MRI licence in Longman is located at the Caboolture Hospital. They operate extended hours from 7am to 10pm as well as weekends. Still they cannot cope with the demands of servicing the entire region and wait times regularly extend for over a week.

• The existing MRI scanner


The MRI machine at Caboolture Hospital is a 1.5T which limits the region's ability to perform research studies, prostate or breast imaging.

<u>Problem Two: Need for MRI services to treat patients arriving via Ambulance</u>

Morayfield Health Hub (MHH) is designed to receive ambulance patients for care and treatment avoiding the need for hospitalisation or hospital based medical services.


For many of these patients to be treated successfully at the MHH they will require access to MRI imaging. Without a fully licenced MRI scanner in the building these patients will either have to pay \$400 for imaging or receive ambulance transfer to the Caboolture Hospital, where they will add to the MRI waiting lists, and then back again for treatment.


MRI LICENCES

The Solution

If the Department of Health issues a full MRI licence then MHH will be able to adequately diagnose and treat patients arriving by ambulance.

Access to this imaging will relieve the burden currently placed upon the solitary licensed MRI in the region currently at Caboolture Hospital.

With access to Medicare funding, X-Ray & Imaging will commit to increase investment to ensure that a 3T MRI scanner will be installed at MHH.

This facility will provide local patients with prostate and breast imaging (currently not available in Longman) as well as undertake the necessary imaging for research and teaching of MSK medicine.
