6. Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and New South Wales Health with regard to Human Health Reports it submitted as part of its voyage arriving in Perth on 26 March?
7. Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and either the Department of Home Affairs and/or the Australian Border Force with regard to Human Health Reports it submitted as part of its voyage arriving in Perth on 26 March?
8. Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and the Minister for Home Affairs or his office with regard to Human Health Reports it submitted as part of its voyage arriving in Perth on 26 March?
9. In relation to Question 1 – did any official from the Department of Agriculture ask medical staff on board the MV Artania whether patients were displaying symptoms consistent with COVID-19?
10. In relation to Questions 2 and 3 – did any official from the Department of Agriculture raise concerns specifically about the risk of COVID-19 onboard the MV Artania ?

Answer:

1. The MS Artania first provided a Human Health Report to the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment (DAWE) at 18:00 on 27 February 2020.
2. On the first Human Health Report, the MS Artania answered in the negative for question 2. Question 2.1.1 of a Human Health Report only needs to be answered if the response to 2 is answered in the positive. As such, the MS Artania provided no response to question 2.1.1.

3. The MS Artania provided a subsequent 15 Human Health Reports to DAWE.

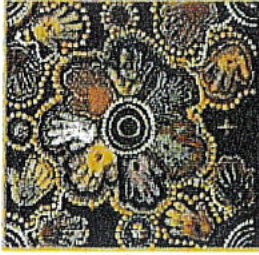
