

## Joint Select Committee on Constitutional Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

The Joint Select Committee on Constitutional Recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples is continuing its important work to inquire into and report on steps that can be taken to progress towards a successful referendum on Indigenous constitutional recognition.

The committee continues to consider options put forward in its interim report and progress report on the form of words that would recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the Constitution.

The committee will hold a public hearing in Adelaide on Friday 13 March 2015. The committee has held 15 public hearings around Australia and published 116 submissions to date.

The committee will present its final report, considering the range of views it has heard at public hearings and in submissions, on or before 30 June 2015.
