## **Question:**

Can the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet provide the following information on the delivery of the Data Integration Partnership for Australia?

- 1. The budget for the project at the time of first approval to proceed?
- 2. The spend to date on the project?
- 3. The current approved budget?

## **Answer:**

1. & 3. Over three years from 2017-18 to 2019-20, the budget for the Data Integration Partnership for Australia (DIPA) announced in the 2017-18 Federal Budget was \$130.8 million.

The following agencies have been directly funded under DIPA:

- Australian Bureau of Statistics (\$37.7 million)
- Department of Social Services (\$29.8 million)
- Department of Health (\$15.6 million)
- Department of Education and Training (\$14.3 million)
- Department of Finance (\$11.0 million)
- Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (\$5.9 million)
- Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (\$3.4 million)
- Data61 (\$1.9 million)

In addition, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet received \$11.2 million to fund specific data analytical projects over the three years. This funding is allocated to departments for specific data analytical projects.

2. As of 28 February 2018, \$14 million has been spend on DIPA in 2017-18.
