



Defence facility upgrade required for larger, heavier field vehicles

Facilities required to support 7500 new field vehicles capable of providing battlefield mobility, logistics support and tactical training will be investigated at a public hearing tomorrow by the Public Works Committee.

The Department of Defence's submission states that in many instances, existing facilities will not be able to support the new fleet, which are larger and heavier than the current vehicles.

Suitable infrastructure is therefore required for Defence Force units at eight sites around Australia. The proposed works will include maintenance workshops, weighbridges, loading ramps, vehicle storage and parking.
