- 1st October 2020, the introduction of DASA’s SUS Bus through Emergency Department Assist Program commenced to alleviate pressure on ASH ED department. The bus collects clients at 10pm, 12pm and 3am, Monday to Saturday night.
 - Numbers have increased year on year with 315 admissions having been triaged from ASH ED and referred to SUS via the service.
- Data shows
 - 2022 saw an 111% increase of women admissions to service
 - Below referral/apprehension pathways increase from 2020 and 2021
 - police apprehension – avg 100% increase
 - Night patrol apprehension – avg 50% increase
 - 208% increase of SUS bus from 2021
 - 100% own care increase from 2021.
 - 2022 Male admissions have increased by 76% from 2021 period but are lower than the same period in 2020 which saw 725 males using the service.

Aranda House

From 21-22 annual Report

- 77.1% percent of the 132 individuals receiving residential care at Aranda House, Independent Living Program and Transitional After Care Units, were Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander with 56.5% being male.
- Aboriginal males between 19-35 years accounted for 64.9% of this cohort
- Alcohol remains the principal drug of concern for Aranda, TACU and ILP clients, with 59.5% identifying this as their primary drug,
- Followed by Methamphetamine at 30.5% . This trend is quite similar to last reporting period where Alcohol and Methamphetamine accounted for 55.32% and 35.11% respectively in drug of choice.
- This year we saw an increase in Cannabis users of 9.2% compared to 6.91% for 2020-21 period and one client stating Heroin as the principal drug of concern

ATC

- Since its commencement as a Residential Rehabilitation
 - 51 women have been admitted to the facility

From 2021-2022 Annual Report

25 residents participated in the Alternative to Custody program during 2021-2022

- Women under 40 made up 72% of clients participating in the program.
- 40% were aged between 30-39 and 32% were aged 18-29
- Women over 40, made up a combined 28% of participants
- 38% of the residents were mothers Of those 10, 5 were single parents and the other half partnered.
