Public hearing on 29 February 2024, Canberra

On 22 June 2023, the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Corporations and Financial Services (the committee) resolved to commence an inquiry into Ethics and Professional Accountability: Structural Challenges in the Audit, Assurance and Consultancy Industry. - the Public Interest Oversight Board (PIOB) (Submission 35).
