



First public hearings for skin cancer inquiry

The House of Representatives Health Committee will this week hold the first two public hearings for its inquiry into skin cancer in Australia.

The hearings are a continuation of an inquiry started by the health committee of the previous parliament, which held a skin cancer roundtable in June 2013.

Australians have more than 12 times the global average rate of melanoma of the skin—the highest recorded incidence in the world.

“Skin cancer affects people from all walks of life in communities across Australia,” said Committee Chair Steve Irons MP.

“These initial Canberra-based hearings are intended to provide a broad snapshot of the current state of play nationally, before the committee embarks on a comprehensive program of hearings around Australia in both cities and regional centres”.

The committee is investigating the awareness, prevention, early diagnosis and management of both melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers.

“The committee is interested both in the success of awareness campaigns in improving skin cancer prevention, and in the effectiveness of our health system in making sure skin cancer patients have access to the best possible diagnosis and treatment services.”
