

Confirming receipt of the QoNs from Senator Waters below. The Chair has provided the following answers:

## Brisbane Airport Community Airspace Advisory Board

1. Outside of official AAB meetings, do you meet with aviation industry reps and if so, how frequently? Although I see aviation industry representatives (such as staff of Airservices Australia) every 3 or 4 months at other forums (such as community forums for the Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast Airports) that would only involve discussions about the AAB in an incidental way (such as checking on progress with follow up). I do speak to Airservices Staff (and occasionally airline representatives) by phone and exchange emails on several occasions between meetings to follow up on action items that have been allocated to me or them. I have had two 'in person' meetings with Airservices to follow up on action items allocated to me.
2. Have you discussed proposals from community representatives with industry representatives? At the end of each AAB meeting we have an agreed action list with all actions allocated as appropriate. If there are any issues, proposals, questions, or other matters that would be appropriate for me to follow up they are listed in the action list and I am accountable to the next meeting for those actions. Every meeting so far has included actions items allocated to me. Community driven follow up for me as Chair has so far not included items that would be considered 'proposals'.
3. For comparison, how often do you have conversations with community representatives outside of official AAB meetings? As I am Canberra based I have not had regular meetings with community members, but have had frequent email and telephone contact with the community members of the AAB between meetings. This has been both as follow up to meetings and on issues raised with me by members outside meetings. I have also met community members and community representatives when in Brisbane for formal AAB meetings. This has included meeting with a representative of the Brisbane Flight Path Community Alliance and meeting with a Brisbane based Senator.
