## Australia's relationship with Mexico Submission 13

Re: Inquiry into Australia's relationship with Mexico

We are citizens of Australia and Mexico and want to express our ideas in these two topics: a) potential opportunities for enhanced trade and investment ties and b) Increased collaboration in the education sector and the potential for extending scholarship programs to Mexico.

## a) Potential opportunities for enhanced trade and investment ties
