Parliamentary inquiry to hold hearings in Alice Springs

The <u>Parliamentary Inquiry into a better family law system to support and protect those affected by</u> <u>family violence</u> will travel to Alice Springs on Tuesday to hold a public hearing.

The Chair of the Committee, <u>Sarah Henderson MP</u>, said: "Aboriginal women are 34 times more likely to be hospitalised because of family violence-related assaults than non-Indigenous Australians. It is important that the Inquiry take evidence on how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families experience family violence and, importantly, how the family law system can better protect and support these families."
