To the Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide input to the inquiry into the Australian Government's role in the development of cities.

Nokia welcomes the Government's focus on cities as a critical component of our emerging national economy, including recognition through the Smart Cities Agenda of the role of digital technology as a disruptor posing new policy and growth opportunities and challenges.
