



## Latest Round of Hearings for Skin Cancer Inquiry

The House of Representatives Health Committee will hold public hearings in Canberra, Sydney and Newcastle from 28 to 30 July in reference to its skin cancer inquiry in Australia.

The committee is investigating the awareness, prevention, early diagnosis and management of both melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers. To date the Committee has held 8 public hearings across Australia and received 68 submissions representing a diverse range of views.

Representatives of several peak bodies within the medical profession, leading research scientists and a range of clinical practitioners are among the types of organisations and individuals that will be appearing before the Committee for its latest round of hearings.

“New skin cancer treatments are now available, with gene-targeted drugs and drugs that boost the immune system offering new hope for melanoma patients and their families,” Mr Irons said.

“These new treatments raise community expectation about what can be done to treat melanoma in the short term so the committee is interested in finding out more about how new treatments can reach melanoma patients sooner.”
