

Status of Match-Fixing Legislation Amendments- Criminal Offences as at 6 March 2013

State	Status
NSW	The NSW Parliament has passed the <i>Crimes Amendment (Cheating at Gambling) Act 2012</i> which creates offences for match-fixing behaviours and penalties of up to 10 years imprisonment. The <i>Act</i> commenced on 13 September 2012.
ACT	The ACT Government is considering its position on this matter in light of the Australian Crime Commission findings.
VIC	The Victorian Government has introduced a Bill into parliament to provide criminal provisions for cheating at sport.
TAS	The Tasmanian Government has announced that will introduce specific match-fixing offences as soon as possible.
SA	Legislation was introduced to Parliament on 29 November 2012 which is currently being reviewed by Upper House and is expected to be passed by the end of March 2013.
WA	Western Australian Government intends on relying on existing criminal code provisions.
NT	The Northern Territory Government is considering legislative provisions to be implemented as soon as practicable.
QLD	The Queensland Government intends on relying on existing criminal code provisions.
