#### COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT EXPLOSIVE ORDNANCE FACILITIES NORTHERN NEW SOUTH WALES REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

1. The Explosive Ordnance Facilities Northern New South Wales Redevelopment Project was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works on 1 July 2024. The project proposes to deliver new and upgraded facilities and infrastructure at Defence Establishment Orchard Hills, New South Wales.

2. This report is to inform the Committee of the nature and extent of community consultation that has been undertaken by the Department of Defence for the proposed works. The aim of the consultation is to ensure local communities and other stakeholders are:

- a. well informed about the project details through effective and proven communication channels; and
- b. provided the opportunity to raise any concerns or issues, or to seek further information regarding the project so that, wherever feasible, Defence can address these in its proposed works.

3. The following stakeholder and community consultation activities have been undertaken in accordance with the project's comprehensive community engagement strategy:

- a. Community information sessions were advertised in local newspapers in Sydney and the Penrith region, and were held in Glenmore Park on 9 May 2024. These details are included in the example advertisement shown at **Annex A**.
- b. The type of information Defence presented to the public is shown at **Annex B**, and the level of attendance is provided at **Annex C**.
- c. Key stakeholders, including Federal, State and Local Members of Government, and local Indigenous communities were invited to receive a personal briefing

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about the project. An example of the invitation that was sent out is at **Annex D**, and a list of all stakeholders engaged by Defence, including the status of each engagement, is at **Annex E**.

d. A project webpage, email address and phone number have been set up to receive submissions and questions about the project. These details are at **Annex F**.

4. Information about the proposed works was generally well received at the community information sessions and feedback to date has been supportive. A summary of topics and key issues raised during community information sessions and via the project email address and phone number is at **Annex G**.

- 5. Comments raised by members of the community focused on:
- e. the project scope and if it involves further explosive ordnance training/activities, the planned relocation of personnel from Defence leased premises in Penrith, NSW, and traffic management along The Northern Road;
- f. the new Western Sydney Airport and any potential impacts of new flight paths on the proposed works; and
- g. opportunities for local industry participation in the proposed works.

6. Consultation activities have concluded. Defence will provide a briefing to Federal, State and Local Members of Government contacted during the consultation process should they request one.
