RE: Senate Inquiry into Mental Health Funding

As a member of the Australian Psychological Society's College of Counselling Psychologists with Specialist Endorsement through the Australian Health Practitioners Agency (AHPRA), I am writing to express my concern in two areas: changes to the Medicare Benefits Schedule and the two tier rebate system.

Changes to MBS

Reducing the number of sessions available to patients from 18 (in exceptional circumstances) to a limit of 10, increases the risk of relapse, which can leave people more vulnerable and discouraged about the effectiveness of psychological treatment. Patients currently being seen under the 12 plus 6 allowance, are being treated successfully with long term gains in mind.

Two Tier System

Training in Counselling Psychology *specifically focuses upon* providing assessment, diagnosis and psychological therapy for mental health disorders. To only consider Clinical Psychologists for this work limits client access to the high quality treatment we provide in *our area of expertise*.

Additionally, the two tier system has created a divide in the way Clinical and Counselling Psychologists are viewed by General Practitioners, Psychiatrists and the public, with Clinicals deemed more specialized due to the higher rebate their clients receive.
