I write to clarify evidence provided at the public hearing of the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Legislation Committee on 26 April 2024.

On page 27 of the Proof Committee Hansard, in response to questions from Senator Scarr about expected results against our performance measures for the current financial year, I said:

Mr Crew: I think the KPI that Mr Hawkins was referring to was 75 per cent being finalised within 12 months. Again, we're unlikely to meet that target this year. But what we were at, year to date, at the end of March is consistent with the last two years. We were at 59 per cent at that point in time. Last year it was 61 per cent, and the year before it was 58 per cent.

I wish to clarify my evidence to confirm that the timeliness result I provided for 2021-22 (58 per cent) was for the Administrative Appeals Tribunal (AAT) excluding the Immigration Assessment Authority (IAA). The timeliness result for 2021-22 for the AAT including the IAA was 60 per cent.
