It is extremely important that the government takes steps to stop Gambling Venue predators from encouraging Compulsive Gamblers to venues.

The Gambling venues are all full and I mean full of compulsive gamblers that <u>work there</u>! That's right the staff are often compulsive gamblers. With thousands in credit card debt also. So how can they effectively monitor other Compulsive Gamblers??

It doesn't make sense to have the blind leading the blind.

Perhaps an enquiry or a survey into the staff at the gambling venues would show that most if not all are compulsive gamblers. Which means any of your courses regarding Gambling is a waste of everyones time. AS they will allow gamblers to gamble.

The staff also never give notes of 50s to players. Only 20s so they can go straight back in.
