He is at this point working for an Australian company who has recognized his skills and knowledge beneficial to their company. He has been waiting for his Permanent residence for past 1 year. With passing of this bill, it will not only create depression, frustration and sadness for my family but also misery as my parents hope to see their children live together in Australia. There have been immense efforts from my side, on my brother's part and from our family. We have always believed Australia to be Fair country and passing this bill would fail this government in our eyes.
