COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT: NAVY CAPABILITY INFRASTRUCTURE SUB-PROGRAM: FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE TO SUPPORT NEW NAVY CAPABILITIES

This letter is to inform the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works of the nature and extent of community consultation undertaken by the Department of Defence as part of the proposed Navy Capability Infrastructure Sub-program (NCIS): Facilities and Infrastructure to Support New Navy Capabilities (the Project).

The Project proposes to deliver works at eight sites nationally:

- a. two in Western Australia (HMAS Stirling and Rockingham);
- b. two in Queensland (HMAS *Cairns* and Cairns);
- c. two in the Northern Territory (HMAS Coonawarra and RAAF Darwin); and
- d. two in South Australia (St Kilda Transmitting Station and Osborne).

Defence undertook consultation activities in each state and territory listed above. The aim of these activities was to ensure the community and other stakeholders were:

- a. well informed about the Project's details; and
- b. provided an opportunity to raise any concern or seek further information so that, wherever feasible, Defence could address these in its program of works.

The community and stakeholder engagement activities listed below were delivered in accordance with the Project's community engagement strategy:

a. Formal letters offering individual briefings and details of the planned community information forums were e-mailed to key stakeholders, such as Federal, State and Territory members, local government officials and other identified key community and industry stakeholders. An example of the correspondence is at Annex A.

A list of stakeholders who received an invitation for a private briefing, and the status of each invitation, are at Annex B.

b. Conducting six Community Information Forums between 8 and 16 October 2019 - two in Rockingham (Western Australia), one in Cairns (Queensland), one in Darwin (Northern Territory), and one in Osborne and one in St Kilda (South Australia). Advertisements were posted in local newspapers between 2 and 9 October 2019 - the Sound Telegraph, Cockburn Sound Herald and Westside Weekly Messenger (Western Australia), The Cairns Post (Queensland), NT News (Northern Territory) and North Eastern Weekly Messenger (South Australia). Local newspapers were selected given the local focus of these projects. An example of the advertisements is provided in Annex C.

A summary of the attendance at each Community Information Forum is provided at Annex D. Examples of the information displayed at the Forums (feather boards) is provided at Annex E. A summary of the key points raised during these consultations is provided at Annex F.

- c. Posting 12 promotional posters about the Community Information Forums at key locations in high pedestrian traffic locations. Locations were selected based on proximity to the proposed project site and the potential impact of the Project on residents in the area. An example of the posters is at <u>Annex G</u>.
- d. Distributing approximately 4,653 flyers via letterbox drop to homes nearby each proposed project site in each of the States/Territory. An example of the flyers and distribution zones are provided in <u>Annex H</u>.
- e. Raising a publicly accessible project website to announce information about the Project and receive questions from interested parties.

While Defence's consultation to date has generally been positive and supportive of the proposed works, two specific-to-location issues were raised:

a. **HMAS** *Cairns* (Queensland) site: The Cairns Navy League of Australia which is affiliated to the Queensland Division expressed concern regarding the demolition of a particular building on the Base. The League stated the building has heritage value; although it is not listed on the Defence Heritage Register, nor the Queensland Heritage Register. Defence is assessing if the building has local heritage value. The League also confirmed it strongly supports the proposed project.

b. HMAS Stirling (Western Australia) site: The Mayor of the City of Rockingham raised his concern regarding the traffic to and from the Base that uses council roads. This concern, which is not project-specific, has been raised a number of times by the Mayor and the Council with both the Commanding Officer HMAS Stirling and the Base Manager. The Mayor stated he has also raised this concern with the Government of Western Australia because the road in question is classified as a 'Local' road, and the Council is of the view it should be re-classified as a 'State' road. The Mayor advised that this does not impact on his strong support for the Project.

Community consultation activities are continuing as indicated at <u>Annex B</u>. The outcomes from the ongoing briefings can be advised at the 20 November 2019 Hearing.

On behalf of the Department of Defence, I would like to inform you of works proposed at Henderson under the Navy Capability Infrastructure Sub-program (NCIS). These works are subject to Parliamentary approval.

I am writing to you in your capacity as the Member for Fremantle, to offer a personal briefing on the proposed works in your Electorate

On 10 September 2019, the Assistant Minister for Finance, Charities and Electoral Matters, Senator the Hon Zed Seselja referred the project to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works (PWC) for its consideration. The full Statement of Evidence can be viewed on the PWC's website:

https://www.aph.gov.au/Parliamentary_Business/Committees/Joint/Public_Works/NCIS

The aim of the project is to provide facilities and infrastructure to support the introduction into service of the Hunter Class Frigates and the Arafura Class Offshore Patrol Vessels at: HMAS Stirling and Henderson (WA); HMAS Coonawarra and RAAF Darwin (NT); HMAS Cairns (QLD); and St Kilda Transmitting Station and Osborne (SA).

The proposed works include the acquisition of land at Henderson and the construction of new office accommodation, new support facilities and engineering services. If approved, the proposed works will be wholly situated on Defence-managed land, with works scheduled to commence in 2020.

Similar to other major Defence infrastructure projects, the project will generate employment opportunities in the construction sector and related support sectors in the local area.





Figure 1: Location






Figure 1: Location




Figure 1: Location




Figure 1: Location






Figure 1: Location

SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS RAISED DURING CONSULTATION (BY STATE AND TERRITORY)

Attendees were keen to participate in consultation opportunities and engaged with Defence's Project Team with a level of educated understanding and appreciation of the value Defence brings to local communities.

Stakeholders held a common interest in the overall Project, and sought information about the project's scope and local economic benefits. All stakeholders fully supported the project and the investment that Defence is proposing in their respective local areas.

There was common interest amongst stakeholders regarding the potential opportunities available to local contractors and suppliers, including questions regarding time-frames and how to tender for works during construction. Defence explained the potential prime construction contractors are required to prepare Local Industry Capability Plans as part of their tenders, which outline the construction contractor's objectives for local industry participation and the initiatives proposed to meet these objectives. Defence further advised that the prime construction contractor's performance in adhering to its Local Industry Capability Plan will be monitored and reported on throughout construction. Stakeholders did not raise any concerns with these procedures and recognised that it provided local industry with the opportunity to tender for work.

There was concern raised by stakeholders at two locations – Darwin (Northern Territory) and Rockingham (Western Australia) regarding traffic. Stakeholders expressed concern regarding the potential for increased congestion and heavy vehicle traffic during construction.

At Darwin, there is the potential for increased traffic over-and-above the existing construction traffic volume. Defence explained that the existing traffic associated with the works being proposed at HMAS *Coonawarra* would be well below that associated with the construction traffic connected to the separate Larrakeyah Defence Precinct Redevelopment Project which is under construction.

At Rockingham (Western Australia), the issue of traffic has been raised for previous Defence projects on HMAS *Stirling*. This is being addressed by the City of Rockingham Council. Defence explained the specific measures that will be implemented and managed by the construction contractor; this includes liaising with the Council to mitigate the impact of heavy vehicle traffic associated with the proposed project. Stakeholders were generally accepting that the impacts of traffic could be mitigated to some extent by measures undertaken by the construction contractor during the construction phase.

Navy Capability Infrastructure Sub-program Submission 1 - Supplementary Submission 2

At Cairns (Queensland), a Community Organisation (Navy League of Australia) expressed concerns in relation to the proposed demolition of a building located at HMAS *Cairns* that it perceives to have some heritage value. Defence advised that the building is not listed on the Defence Heritage Register or the Cairns Regional Council heritage register, and is required to be demolished to allow for the new HMAS *Cairns* wharf. The League accepted the explanation although requested Defence consider relocating the building.

At each of the Community Information forums held, stakeholders appreciated Defence making itself available and approachable to discuss the Project, acknowledge community concerns and present the considerations to mitigate issues.
