Submission to the Inquiry into the Fair Work Amendment (Small Business-Penalty Rates Exemption) Bill 2012

Dear Committee Members,

I am writing in regard to the bill Senator Xenophon has put before parliament to axe penalty rates.

Although many business are open on weekends now, we are still traditionally a Monday to Friday society. Family time still tends to be the weekend.

I feel it is very important that if you work in an industry that requires you to work weekends, that you should be compensated for your loss of family/friendship time.
