#### Summary of request:

The request sought information on the historical cost and forward estimates profile for the following employment services programs:

- Work for the Dole from 2012
- New Enterprise Incentive Scheme from 2015
- Transition to Work from 2016
- Employability Skills Training from 2017
- Career Transition Assistance from 2018
- Entrepreneurship Facilitators from 2022
- Self-Employment Assistance from 2022
- Workforce Specialists from 2022

For each program, the request sought a breakdown based on whether payments were made to the department, providers, jobseekers or employers.

#### Overview

This response provides expense data for the requested employment services programs by financial year since 2011-12 to 2025-26 at Attachment A.

The Department of Employment and Workplace Relations provided the data in January 2023. They advised that departmental funding amounts are provided at the outcome level and further splits by employment services programs are not possible. Given this, Table A1 shows the payment splits by where the payments were made to or are projected to be made to.

The data were rounded to the nearest \$1,000.

- (c) There are no forecasts for the New Enterprise Incentive Scheme as it was replaced by the Self Employment Assistance program on 4 July 2022.
- (d) For the Transition to Work forecasts, the payments to providers include the Youth Bonus Wage Subsidy. Wage subsidy payments are made to employers by providers consistent with the terms and conditions of a participant's individual wage subsidy agreements.
- (e) Figures are provided at the outcome level and include corporate resourcing and corporate overheads, including depreciation, property, leasing and IT costs. In addition, these disclosures include impairments and actuarial adjustments to the department balance sheet in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The departmental total is for the equivalent employment services outcome for each financial year, noting the scope of the outcome differs across each financial year, particularly prior to Administrative Arrangements Orders issued on 18 September 2013, when the relevant outcome included income support, remote employment services and disability employment services.
