Ensure support and equipment is available when needed, People with a disability can choose the types of support to use, The ability to receive services when needed and in the way that suits the person

The most important services for the NDIS to provide are:

Life-skills, In-home care and domestic assistance, Flexible in-home/outside home respite

I support the introduction of the NDIS.

So that every one who gets injured can have the same type and amount of care as a TAC recipient, instead of leaving it to struggling families. I think a .5% (similar to medicare) across the tax paying public would fund this scheme very well.
