# Inquiry into potential impacts of the Commonwealth Paid Parental Leave (PPL) scheme on small businesses and their employees

Issue date: 11 April 2023

The Senate Education and Employment References Committee is inquiring into the potential impacts of the Commonwealth Paid Parental Leave (PPL) scheme on small businesses and their employees, both before and after legislative changes come into effect from 1 July 2023.

The committee is due to present its report on **31 August 2023**.

The inquiry will examine:

- the experiences of small businesses administering the Parental Leave Payment (PLP) on behalf of the Commonwealth;
- the experience of employees accessing PPL and receiving the payment through either their employer or Services Australia;
- how current arrangements preserve relationships between small businesses and their employees who are on PPL:
- the role of PPL in driving employment and female workforce participation in small businesses;
- the administrative arrangements around the PLP, and options to alleviate any administrative or financial burdens;
- the engagement of the Department of Social Services and Services Australia with small businesses and their employees in designing and implementing future PPL policy changes.
