It is difficult to believe Central Queensland Helicopter Rescue Service (RACQ CQ RESCUE) has been operating now for fourteen years.

Since the first flight in 1996 the company has evolved immensely. The first helicopter utilized by CQ RESQ (as it was known then), was a single-engine Bell LongRanger and the crew included a paramedic, and nurses from Mackay Base Hospital. While the helicopter could transport two patients at any one time, the space in the aircraft was cramped with stretchers layered on top of each other.

From this aircraft, to the current situation of having access to two twin-engine single pilot Bell 412 helicopters has taken RACQ CQ RESCUE ahead in leaps and bounds.

The crew now consists of an Intensive Care Paramedic provided by the Queensland Ambulance Service and is available 24/7. We also have a doctor at the RACQ CQ RESCUE base who is funded by the State Government.

Since the doctor and paramedic have been made available to RACQ CQ RESCUE, the number of missions carried out by the rescue helicopter has more than doubled.

With the increase in task numbers and the upgrade to these very capable helicopters, the annual operational cost in 2010 is expected to be \$4.9 million.


G&S operates in some remote locations and it is reassuring to know that, if necessary, one of its employees could call on the service of RACQ CQ RESCUE to assist in an emergency.

Without RACQ CQ RESCUE ...

71 year old Noel would not have received the help he needed when his quad bike flipped back on top of him as he was putting out a fire on his property at Turrawulla near Nebo. The ground gave way causing the quad bike to flip back over the embankment.

Noel sustained a broken neck as a result of his accident and was transported on board the RACQ CQ RESCUE helicopter to Mackay Base Hospital where he underwent further examination and was eventually transferred to Townsville by fixed wing aircraft for specialized care



Without RACQ CQ RESCUE ...

Baby Emily and mum Danielle would be unable to be near family in Mackay.

Danielle contracted pneumonia when she was pregnant and gave birth to Emily at 29 weeks gestation. Danielle and Emily received excellent care in Townsville and when Emily was just 3 weeks old (still 8 weeks prior to her due date), both mum and baby were transferred by RACQ CQ RESCUE from Townsville to Mackay Base Hospital which will be Emily's home for about 6 weeks.



Without RACQ CQ RESCUE ...

Paddy Trumbull's shark bite injury may have resulted in very different circumstances. Paddy along with her husband was taking full advantage of the beautiful Great Barrier Reef when a shark bit into her backside. Paddy was immediately transferred by boat to Hamilton Island where she was met by the RACQ CQ RESCUE helicopter. The medical crew on board the helicopter administered pain relief and she was transferred to Mackay Base Hospital for treatment before eventually being transferred to hospital in Sydney where she and her husband reside.



Without RACQ CQ RESCUE...

Twenty year old Mackay man Jesse would have endured a very long and painful journey by road to receive medical care. Jesse and his friends were trying various manouvers on their motorbikes when Jesse had a horrific accident, severely injuring both hands. RACQ CQ RESCUE flew to Markwell Station, administered treatment and pain relief and transported Jesse to Mackay Base Hospital. At last count Jesse has undergone 6 operations on his hand.



Without RACQ CQ RESCUE ...

Douglas McLauchlan would not have received the attention he needed after he was involved in a fatal accident which claimed the life of his wife Suzanne. The RACQ CQ RESCUE helicopter landed on the road at the Leap near the site of the accident, attended to Douglas at the scene and transferred him to Mackay Base Hospital for further treatment.







Ways you can help us...

This year operational costs for RACQ CQ RESCUE will amount to \$4.9 million. Two million dollars is provided by the State Government which means a minimum of \$3 million is fundraised by the service annually.

Capt. Heath Scanlon (Senior Pilot)
