Since 20 March 2020, is this Department aware of how many mandatory government controlled designated quarantine facilities\* places have been available each month? If yes, please provide this data broken down by state and territory on a monthly basis. \*Commonly referred to as “hotel quarantine” but also including non-hotel facilities like Howard Springs, NT

**Answer:**

The Department allocates passenger capacity to the international airlines under international passenger arrival caps based on the level of international passenger arrivals States advise they can safely manage over the relevant scheduling period given available quarantine capacity and support arrangements in each jurisdiction. The Department does not control the total number of quarantine places available, which is a matter for the relevant State or Territory.

The level of capacity made available under the international passenger arrival caps since they were introduced in each jurisdiction is provided in the Department’s response to IQ21-000055.
