UK Parliamentarians to discuss efforts to end death penalty

The Human Rights Sub-Committee of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade will conduct a public hearing in Canberra this evening as part of its inquiry into Australia's advocacy for the abolition of the death penalty.

The Sub-Committee will hear evidence from the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Abolition of the Death Penalty. The non-partisan Group comprises members of the House of Lords and the House of Commons, who collectively advocate for global abolition of the death penalty, moratoria and reductions in the scope and types of crimes that attract the death penalty.

The Sub-Committee's inquiry is reviewing how Australia currently engages internationally to promote abolition of the death penalty and further steps Australia could take to advocate for worldwide abolition.

Australia has been an active participant in the protection and promotion of human rights, including through its support of the Second Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, aimed at the abolition of the death penalty.

While there has been a global trend toward abolition, more than half the world's countries are yet to sign up to the protocol and in some countries the use of capital punishment appears to be increasing.
