## Committee to discuss PFAS in Canberra

A parliamentary committee will discuss the progress of the Commonwealth Government's response to and management of PFAS contamination in Canberra on Friday 14 September 2018.

The PFAS Sub-Committee of the Parliament's [Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade](#) is examining [the management of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances \(PFAS\) contamination in and around Defence bases](#). The Sub-Committee will meet with Scientific Organisations, Academics and Government representatives at a public hearing on Friday 14 September in Canberra.

Chair of the Sub-Committee, Mr Andrew Laming MP, said the Sub-Committee welcomed the opportunity to discuss how the Commonwealth is managing and coordinating responses from Commonwealth, state and territory and local governments to ensure the best outcomes for those communities affected by PFAS contamination.
