## 1. Safe Rates, Safe Roads - Directions paper of Federal Government's Safe Rates Advisory Group (Nov 2010)

Govt's advisory group calls for independent tribunal to establish & maintain rates & conditions for employees and owner drivers and to make clients accountable for those rates and conditions

# 2. External Influences on health and safety outcomes in NSW long distance trucking: (2010) – Prof Ann Williamson (UNSW) & Rena Friswell (NSW Injury Risk Management Centre, UNSW)

Findings support the mandating of payment of drivers for non-driving work, saying it would reduce the incentive to stay on the road and reduce weekly hours required to make a living.

# 3. Truck Crashes and Work-Related Factors Associated with Drivers and Motor Carriers - Professor Michael Belzer Ph.D (2009)

Report confirms the direct link between pay and work pressures on the one hand and safety outcomes (crashes) on the other.

### 4. TWU/NRMA Survey Release (2011): Fatigue, Overtaking Top Issues for Drivers

#### 5. National Transport Commission Report: Safe Payments (2008)

National Safe Rates Tribunal to be established for Safe Rates and related conditions for Employees and Owner-drivers and dealing with clients.

#### 6. Wright & Quinlan Report: Remuneration and Safety in Road Transport

Confirms link between rates of pay and safety and finds imbalance of bargaining power – recommends National Safe Rates and Conditions Tribunal to deal with these issues.

Rates of Pay and related conditions must be addressed for attraction and retention of drivers and for safer outcomes.
