

I am a person born from a sperm donation and I have been trying to track down my father for 7 years. The first time I tried to get information I received a piece of paper with some vague details about my father. I have very, very basic medical records and a few basic details of his appearance and a few other little things.

Approximately 2 months ago, I rang the organisation my mother went through in South Australia. I was told that they still have my mothers records but not my fathers but I was assured that they could have been misplaced and that someone would call me back. I've called them once since then and was told again that someone would call me back. To this day, I still haven't been called.

I am writing to you to ask that the laws be changed so that myself and other people in a similar situation can have access to more detailed information about their biological father, more preferably have the chance to actually know their father.

It is completely unfair that people born from these circumstances are the only people who do not have access to information about their father or any siblings they may have.

Going by the one little piece of paper that I have, I know that I have one half brother and another half sibling. I believe I should atleast be able to know who they are if knowing my father can never happen.

It is hard not knowing where you came from or who you truly are. It can make a lot of things very difficult. I ask that the laws be changed so that all people, both past and present, born under these circumstances have the choice to know their father if they wish. It would certainly make a lot of people very happy.
