I am writing to provide the Manufacturing Inquiry with additional information on the types of postgraduate programs offered to manufacturing employees in the area of logistics and supply chain management. This is response to a question from panel member Sharon Grierson which RMIT took on notice.

RMIT provides the following postgraduate training courses:

Graduate Certificate of Engineering (Integrated Logistics Management) Graduate Diploma of Engineering (Integrated Logistics Management) Master of Engineering (Integrated Logistics Management)

Graduate Certificate of Business (Logistics Management) Graduate Diploma of Business (Logistics Management) Master of Business (Logistics Management)

These courses can be tailored to meet the training needs of specific organisations. For example, RMIT has conducted both business and engineered based logistics management training for the Australian Defence Force. The courses are designed to be flexible in order to minimise time spent away from the workforce - employees are able to undertake intensive workshops that are supplemented by e-learning. Employees from manufacturing firms (eg. Electrolux) are regular students in these courses.
