The House of Representatives Education and Training Committee will conduct a hearing on Thursday 14 May with representatives from the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations for its inquiry into 'combining school and work: supporting successful youth transitions'.

Committee Chair, Sharon Bird MP, said today 'It's clear that a large proportion of students are combining school and part-time or casual work. The Committee has recently conducted a series of hearings in secondary schools around the country where we spoke directly with young people about the challenges they are facing in achieving a healthy school-work balance.'

'The Committee looks forward to the opportunity to speak with representatives from the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations about initiatives which promote a healthy balance of work and study, and which support young people in their career development and prospects for successful transition.'
