World Trade Organisation Agreements

The World Trade Organisation Agreements fall under four broad themes – goods, services, intellectual property, and dispute settlement (these are highlighted in bold text in the table). The other agreements are more detailed for specific sectors or issues. Each agreement includes a lengthy schedule which lists each country's commitment to allow foreign access to their markets.¹
