I now refer to my submission including my letters of 25th July 2007 and 12th August 2007 to you and members of your Committee concerning the criminal offences of re and the Lack of Law Enforcement Integrity of APRA and ASIC.

If you are following media reports (see The Australian Business Section yesterday) many people are now calling for a Royal Commission into ASIC because of its reluctance to act promptly, if at all, against corporate criminals.

This has been a rude shock to the thousands of older people already affected by corporate criminals and their immediate families, friends and acquaintances who are horrified at witnessing the devastating affect of their loss.

These are older people who once believed in the close scrutiny and protection of ASIC against corporate criminals. Where do they now turn for protection if ASIC fails to act?

I am now enclosing for the attention of members of your Committee, a copy of my letter of the 17th August 2007 sent to the Prime Minister through the Secretary of the Prime Ministers Department, Dr Peter Shergold, concerning criminal offences of in relation to as well as the Lack of Law Enforcement Integrity of APRA and ASIC.

The said letter of 17h August 2007 also has enclosed a copy of my letter to Fred Rowley, President of the Institute of Actuaries i connection with my complaints against actuaries and

The attachments to my Fred Rowley letter of the 5th July 2007 also provide documentary evidence of the serious criminal offences committed by and under Commonwealth laws which I have also forwarded today to Senator David Johnston Minister for Federal Police.
