



Inquiry into Potential Reforms of National Security Legislation

Committee hearings on Reforms to National Security Legislation in Sydney

Numerous submitters to the inquiry into Potential Reforms to National Security Legislation will give evidence at a public hearing of the Parliamentary Joint Committee on Intelligence and Security in Sydney on Wednesday 26 September.

Committee Chair Mr Anthony Byrne MP said the Committee will discuss a number of issues which the Committee are seeking information on.

“Clearly, several key issues have emerged in the course of our hearings and in submissions made to the committee. The committee will hear how the proposed changes to National Security Legislation will assist law enforcement agencies and intelligence agencies as well as detail potential privacy impacts.

“It is important that the proposed reforms in this area are widely discussed with industry players, concerned groups and law enforcement and intelligence agencies within the Australian community. The Committee’s inquiry is a valuable first step in providing feedback to the Government on views relating to such changes.”
