NATIONAL INQUIRY INTO THE ROLE AND POTENTIAL OF THE NATIONAL BROADBAND NETWORK.

Dear Sharon,

We thought that it would be of value to your committee and to our school to find out and express the views of Young People at our school in regards to how we use and enjoy the internet today and what are the main areas of need are, and what is likely to be of use to us in the future.

We only found out about this opportunity to express our opinions five days ago by a youth worker who works at our school. His main role is to support Young People who have experienced the 2009 Victorian bush fires, but he does other work as well.

Our principal and assistant principals were hugely supportive for us to be able to get our whole school involved in such a short time frame. It was fun but a fair bit of pressure on top of our other school commitments.

We, the organizing group designed, circulated and collated a survey to the whole student body. The survey has 8 topic areas with 53 multiple choice options within those 8 topics and an extra comment section.

Due to the short time fame we managed to canvas 380 students out of approx 700 students at our school as we ran out of time. The people who responded were a good representation from all year levels 7 though to 12 and they were all keen to get involved.

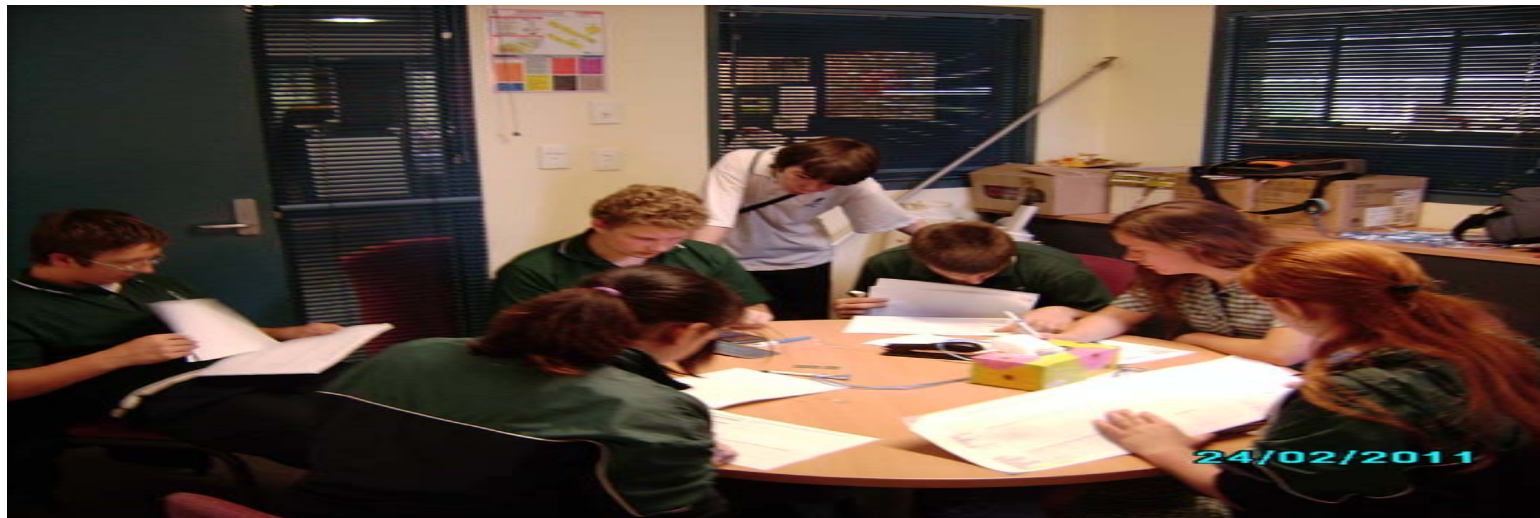
We believe the following information will be of use to your inquiry and we hope we are not the only Young People who have responded to this opportunity.

Dear Sharon and committee, below is two anecdotal summary statements about the responses in this survey and an accurate result in percentages and numbers as to what Young People at out school use and think of in relation to the internet.

- Entertainment, social communication and researching information were stand out results in our survey. The benefits of feeling positive about 'your self' by communicating with friends and family are stated as a major benefit of the internet. Speeding this communication up and improving visual communication will be a huge benefit in the future.
- Knowledge about community disasters like bush fires is also noted as a huge need. Please note the result around bush fires at 36% represents approximately 90% of all young people living in bushfire effected/ prone areas, wanting to use the internet to protect their future safety and the safety of family and friends.
