Statement of Purposes

We come together with a shared interest in defending Australia's freedoms and values afforded us by our Constitution and our Laws, which allow for freedom of speech, freedom of association and equality for all people regardless of ethnicity, race, colour, gender or religious belief, so long as that belief does not contravene Australian law. Our purpose is to defend these values against any ideologies that seek to diminish or replace them. In particular we shall strive

1. To support non-Muslim scholars on Islamic scripture and religious doctrine and make their knowledge available to the wider public and media in Australia.
2. To research, establish, publish and maintain a register of all individuals, enablers, groups and entities engaging in the Islamisation of Australia, both directly and indirectly, including a database of Halal food processors, manufacturers and importers.
3. To raise public awareness of the dangers of Sharia and Islamisation.
4. To inform interested persons and groups about tactics and practises of Islamic proselyting (dahwa), often under the disguise of 'interfaith' work and the infiltration of non-islamic societies by Islamists, their overseas facilitators and their sympathisers and supporters in Australia.
5. To lobby for restrictions on immigration to Australia for individuals submitting to the doctrine of Islamic law and actively and/or financially supporting the introduction of any aspect of Islamisation and/or Sharia in Australia.
6. To lobby for the legal prohibition of favouritism, special considerations and facilities dedicated to Islamic groups and individuals seeking the Islamisation and/or establishing aspects of Sharia in Australia.
7. To assert amongst members, and to lobby our politicians, media and the public, that the Australian community and our immigration programs should primarily be guided by the spirit of integration, unity and equality of all Australians, and not by segregation, apartheid and tribalism along ethnic and religious lines.
8. To lobby for preferential consideration and fast-tracking of visa applications from non-Muslim applicants from Islamic countries
9. To establish that, while members share the view that Australia is a predominantly Western nation, based primarily on Judeo-Christian heritage as well as classic European/Humanistic values, the society shall be secular and not associated with any religious belief- system.
10. To secure ongoing funding for the work of the society.
