# **House Economics Committee - Reserve Bank hearing**

## 10:00am, Friday 11 May, 2001 Victorian State Parliament House, Melbourne - Media information -

The House of Representatives Economics Committee will hold its next six-monthly public hearing with Reserve Bank Governor Ian Macfarlane and other representatives of the Reserve Bank in Melbourne on Friday, 11 May, 2001.

The hearing will be held in the Legislative Council Chamber of Victoria's State Parliament Building (Spring Street). It will be part of the official Centenary of Federation events that week in Melbourne.

## Media access & seating

The hearing will be on the floor of the Legislative Council Chamber of the Victorian State Parliament, around the central table. Media will have access to the floor of the Chamber.

<u>Entry</u>: via front entrance of Victorian State Parliament House. Look for House of Representatives signage in the entrance hall for the appropriate entry point.

<u>Seating plan</u>: Journalists will be seated close to the 'action', in the seats occupied by front and backbench Government MLCs when parliament is sitting. *A floor plan is attached/follows.* 

<u>Vision</u>: photographers and TV cameramen will be able to shoot the 'overhead' view of the hearing from the first floor balcony for the first 20 minutes of the hearing only. After that, all vision will be from the floor of the Chamber, where there will be no restrictions on movement, except for normal sensitivities.

Split box: a split box will be provided.

<u>Direct feed to Parliament House, Canberra</u>: Parliament's Sound and Vision Office will provide an audio feed only into Parliament House, Canberra (no vision)

<u>Internet</u>: an audio feed of the hearing will be streamed from the live webcast link of the Parliament's website, <a href="http://www.aph.gov.au">http://www.aph.gov.au</a>

<u>All media</u>: Please be set up at least 10 minutes prior to the hearing, which will commence at 10:00am sharp.

<u>Story angles</u>: besides the fact of Governor's appearance itself, and 'hard news' questioning about interest rate policy, credit card interchange fees, operation of the Board etc ... a colour angle is the attendance of economics students from Melbourne schools and universities. Students will also be seated around the Chamber, getting a first hand look at the Committee and the Reserve in operation. Students have also been able to submit questions to the Committee to be put to the Governor.
