Re parentage determination - in general Australian assessments will be accepted based on our decisions about parentage (as is the case with USA orders sent to Australia). However, a parent would still be able to challenge paternity, as would be the case with a domestic case. Where paternity is being challenged, the mother is usually required to prepare an affidavit (US child support assist with this) stating who the father is. DNA testing follows using accredited labs who have strict controls about chain of custody, etc. At the OCSE web site www.acf.hhs.gov there is an online interstate resource guide that includes details of paternity testing for each state.
