The break and entry is on the increase. The elderly in retirement units complain that the gauze on their security doors is slashed and a hand or fingers can fit through the hole and then turn the key on the inside of the door and enter the unit and they then demand money from the occupants.

We had a break-in many years ago when living 75ks from town. Very little was taken from the house but great destruction was down to the house and furniture. The juveniles were caught and they were put in custody. I inquired as to where the girl was sent and what training she was given. Her daily routine was to make her bed and the rest of the time she would probably play hand ball. No training was given as to learn to cook, clean, sew, etc. This particular girl is out in the community still causing trouble.

I hope this information is helpful to what Mr Cobb was requiring.
