



Talking Indigenous Languages

The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs will be holding public hearings in Broome, Halls Creek, and Darwin as part of its inquiry into language learning in Indigenous communities.

The Committee will hear evidence from a range of people including Indigenous language groups, teachers, linguists, interpreters and government representatives from urban, regional and remote areas.

The Committee Chair Shayne Neumann stated 'At the Committee's meetings in Broome, Halls Creek and Darwin we will be discussing the importance of Indigenous languages and the benefits of language projects in strengthening Indigenous identity, education and employment outcomes and measures to improve Indigenous interpreting and translating services.

'The Committee recognises the dedicated local Indigenous community organisations and individuals throughout Australia who are working to maintain and revive Indigenous languages – the first Australian languages. The Committee looks forward to hearing from people based in regions of Western Australia and the Northern Territory involved with Indigenous language projects.'
