

**Amendment to Annex 1 to the
1996 Protocol to the Convention on the Prevention of Marine Pollution
by Dumping of Wastes and Other Matter, 1972**

The Amendment set out below was unanimously adopted on 2 November 2006 at the First Meeting of the Contracting Parties to the London Protocol, held in London from 30 October to 3 November 2006.

Amendment to Annex 1 – Wastes or other matter that may be considered for dumping:

New sub-paragraph:

“1.8 Carbon dioxide streams from carbon dioxide capture processes for sequestration”

...

In paragraph 3, replace “1.7” with “1.8”, to take account of the new paragraph 1.8.

New paragraph:

- “4 Carbon dioxide streams referred to in paragraph 1.8 may only be considered for dumping, if:
- .1 disposal is into a sub-seabed geological formation; and
 - .2 they consist overwhelmingly of carbon dioxide. They may contain incidental associated substances derived from the source material and the capture and sequestration processes used; and
 - .3 no wastes or other matter are added for the purpose of disposing of those wastes or other matter.”
