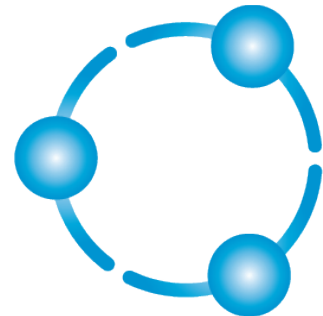




Same-Sex Marriage Study

Commissioned by: Australian Marriage Equality and
Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays
October 2010





1. Methodology



Methodology

- ▶ This study was conducted on the Galaxy Omnibus on the weekend of 8-10 October 2010.
- ▶ The sample was 1,050 respondents aged 18 years and older distributed throughout Australia, as follows:
 - NSW/ACT 316
 - Victoria/Tasmania 296
 - Queensland 192
 - South Australia 124
 - Western Australia 124
- ▶ Interviews were conducted using CATI (computer assisted telephone interviewing) with telephone numbers randomly selected from electronic White Pages. All interviewers were personally trained and briefed on the requirements of the study.
- ▶ Age, gender and region quotas were applied to the sample.
- ▶ Following the completion of interviewing, the data was weighted by age, gender and region to reflect the latest ABS population estimates.



2. Main Findings



Main Findings

- ▶ The majority (62%) of Australians agree that same-sex couples should be able to marry. This is up from the previous measure on 31st May 2009 of 60%. Note that while the question is the same, the latest question also includes the introduction “A number of countries allow same-sex couples to marry. These include Argentina, Canada, The Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, South Africa and Spain, as well as parts of the United States and Mexico”.
- ▶ One in four (25%) Australians ‘strongly agree’ that same sex couples should be able to marry (44% of age 18-24 years and 16% of age 50+ years strongly agree). One in five (21%) ‘strongly disagree’ (13% of ages 18-24 years and 30% of ages 50+ years). Clearly same-sex marriage is a status whose time is coming. Overall 80% of 18-24 years olds agree that same-sex couples should be able to marry compared to 46% of ages 50+ years.
- ▶ Females are more likely than males to agree that same-sex couples should be able to marry (67% compared to 57% among males), however this difference is less than that found in May 2009 (68% compared to 53% among males) suggesting that males have improved in acceptance of the idea.
- ▶ Australians who intend to vote for The Greens or the Australian Labor Party are significantly more likely to agree that same-sex couples should be able to marry than those who intend to vote for the coalition or other parties:
 - 81% of those who intend to vote for The Greens agree
 - 74% of those who intend to vote for ALP agree
 - 48% of those who intend to vote for the coalition agree
 - 58% of those who intend to vote for others agree



Main Findings

- ▶ Households with children aged less than eighteen years are more likely to agree that same-sex couples should be able to marry (72% agree compared to 56% in other households).

Conscience Vote

- ▶ Three in four (78%) of Australians believe that there should be a conscience vote when a bill to allow same sex couples to marry is introduced in parliament.
- ▶ Australians who intend to vote for The Greens are more likely to agree (compared with other voters for other parties) that there should be a conscience vote when a bill to allow same- sex couples to marry is introduced in parliament, although there is generally strong support among all voters:
 - 88% of those who intend to vote for The Greens agree
 - 80% of those who intend to vote for ALP agree
 - 75% of those who intend to vote for the coalition agree
 - 81% of those who intend to vote for others agree



3. Questionnaire

SECTION D – ASK IF AGED 18 YEARS AND OVER

- D1. A number of countries allow same-sex couples to marry. These include Argentina, Canada, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, South Africa and Spain, as well as parts of the United States and Mexico. Do you agree or disagree that same-sex couples in Australia should be able to marry?
- IF AGREE** Is that strongly agree or just agree?
- IF DISAGREE** Is that strongly disagree or just disagree?
- D2. A conscience vote is where politicians do not have to vote according to the official line of their party. Do you believe that there should be a conscience vote when a bill to allow same-sex couples to marry is introduced in parliament?

4. Detailed Tabular Findings



▶ **The tables of findings are set out such that they include the following details:**

1 BASE: Weight Sample (000's):

The number of completed interviews has been weighted to reflect the latest ABS population estimates. These estimates are shown in thousands (000's). The percentages in the table are based on these weighted figures.

2 WEIGHTS:

This indicates that in order to reflect the latest ABS population estimates the data has been weighted by age, gender and area.

3 FILTERS (Where applicable):

If the table is based on a subset of respondents then this will be titled as a Filter and accompanied by a description of the sample upon which the table is based.

4 RESPONDENTS:

These figures show the actual sample size, indicating the total number of respondents who were asked the relevant question.



▶ **Each question has been analysed by a series of demographic variables as follows:**

→ **SEX:**

- Male
- Female

→ **AGE:**

- 16-24 years
- 25-34 years
- 35-49 years
- 50 years or older

→ **MARITAL STATUS:**

- Married (married/de facto/living together)
- Not married (never married/separated/divorced/widowed)

→ **MAIN GROCERY BUYER:**

- Yes/Shared
- No

→ **CHILDREN AT HOME:**

- Children under 18 living in the household
- No children under 18 living in the household



→ **WORK STATUS:**

- Working full-time
- Working part-time
- Not working

→ **SOCIO-ECONOMIC STATUS:**

- *Occupation of the main income earner of the household:*
 - White collar (professional/senior management, upper white collar, lower white collar)
 - Blue collar (upper blue collar, lower blue collar)

→ **LOCATION:**

- NSW / ACT
- Victoria / Tasmania
- Queensland
- South Australia
- Western Australia

→ **CAPITAL CITY:**

- Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide or Perth
- Rest of Australia



→ **HOUSEHOLD INCOME:**

- Under \$40,000
- \$40,000 - \$69,999
- \$70,000 plus

→ **HIGHEST LEVEL OF SCHOOLING:**

- Below Year 12
- Year 12.

→ **VOTING INTENTION:**

- Intends to vote for the ALP
- Intends to vote for the Coalition (Liberal Party or National Party)
- Intends to vote for The Greens
- Intends to vote for another party or candidate
