**Senator Jonathon Duniam asked:**

In the online survey about proposed noise-sharing time slots, did Airservices Australia give equal consideration to responses from individuals living a significant distance from the Runway 30 RNP-AR flight path as they did to those directly impacted by the noise under the current flight paths in their decision to discontinue the noise-sharing trial? If so, why didn't the responses from those directly impacted get more consideration?

**Answer:**

Airservices did consider the location of respondents however this was one of a number of considerations in the assessment. The assessment was based on the Flight Path Design Principles and the Environmental Management of Changes to Aircraft Operations National Operating Standard, this includes assessment of population overflown, noise impacts, and frequency of operations. The assessments also examined a range of other factors including safety, environment, social impact and emissions.
